At the Senior Presentation evening back in March, it was very pleasing to witness the wonderful sense of Club spirit in evidence. Several trophy winners spoke off the cuff in glowing terms about the Club and how much it means to play for Emu Plains. The committee could not have been happier, for it is this type of spirit that we need to engender to keep the Club buoyant in the years ahead. The committee wants the Club to be seen as an enterprising, welcoming place for young children and men (and their families) to come along to enjoy a good game of cricket and benefit from the added camaraderie in a Club that is proud of its present efforts and history. As President, I can only try to impress upon everyone involved in the Club that the committee will continue to work hard to provide its players with every opportunity to successful.

In season 2005/06, the Club fielded 7 junior and 6 senior sides, equating to approximately 140 registered cricketers ranging in ages from 7 through to the mid 50's. As well, the Club conducted its 'Have-A-Go' programme for some 66 children under the age of 7.

The six Senior teams was an increase on the four in 2004/05, which was a great result for the Club, bringing many new faces into the Emu Plains family. Unfortunately, only 8th Grade made the finals, but the other grades performed admirably and with a bit of luck 1st and 3rd grades could have squeezed into the finals if other results had have gone their way in the final round. The split of teams across the grades (1st to 3rd and 7th to 9th) was very hard to manage at times, particularly if looking to promote or lower players between 3rd and 7th grades. The captains and selectors did an admirable job in ensuring competitive teams turned out each week, and the committee thanks them for their efforts. We all look forward to improved performances next season.

Our junior numbers were down a little from last season, with two teams reaching the semi-finals. It is wonderful to see the junior players competing each week, and improving their knowledge and experience of the wonderful game that is cricket. It was great to see three of the teams competing in division 1 – U/13, U/14, and U/16 – and the tough experience will I'm sure see them grow into well rounded players.

Particular thanks and congratulations to all the following for their efforts throughout season 2005/05:

- Jamie Large for being awarded the 'Clubman of the Year' award. Jamie is a committeeman, captain/player, junior team manager and parent. He really epitomises the spirit of the Club and was a very worthy winner;

- all the various trophy winners;

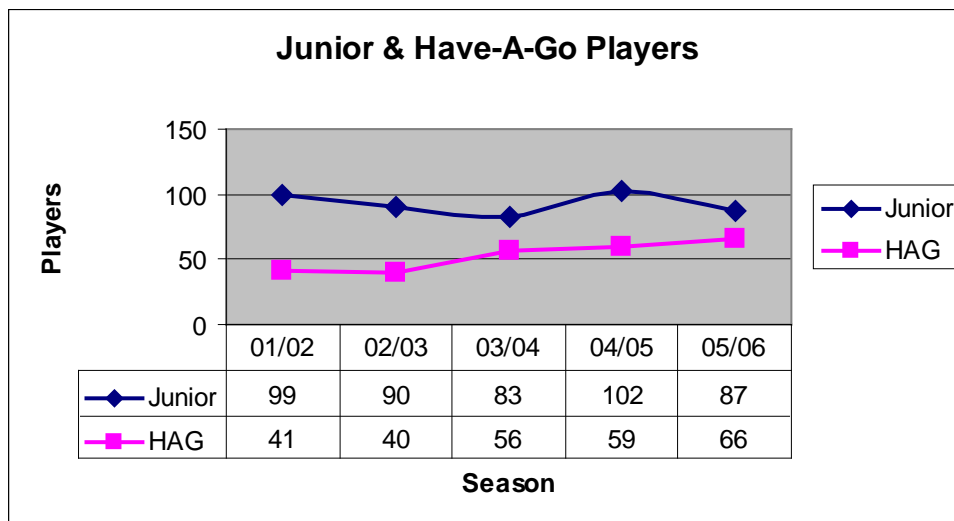

Junior Secretary's Report

Our junior player numbers were 87, down from 102 the previous season, which was a little disappointing given the excitement generated by the recent Ashes series. However, we hope to retain most of these next year, and with a focus on getting our Have-A-Go players through to juniors, hopefully we can increase our junior numbers next season.

The following chart shows Junior and Have-A-Go player numbers over the last five seasons.



Junior registration costs remained the same as the previous season:

Junior: \$70

Junior additional sibling: \$45

Have-A-Go: \$35. Of this, \$20 is paid to Cricket NSW, the remainder being profit by the club.
