

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

With season 2007/08 being one of the most successful for the Club in recent years, season 2008/09 was looked forward to as being one that would bring as much, if not more, success on the field. Despite this optimism we were unable to bring home a premiership in either the Senior or Junior ranks.

But success is not just to be measured in on-field performances. Once again Emu Plains fielded a full list of teams and presented the opportunity for many young men and women to enjoy a game of cricket.

If I was honest I would have to say that this year provided the most challenges from an Administration point of view that I have encountered over the past five years. Our committee performed valiantly once again, and I thank them for that. They really are a hard-working bunch that every player, parent and coach should be appreciative of.

Just prior to the start of the season we were advised that only four clubs had nominated a First Grade side. My immediate reaction (to Secretary Jim Micsko) was to let the association know that Emu Plains would be prepared to field a second side in the First Grade competition. To my mind we had the numbers, drive and ability to do so. And so this happened.

Pat Anderson and Marty Romer, the captains of the two First Grade sides, will no doubt have their say in their respective reports as to the success or otherwise of this decision. My stance was that we should always select our best eleven in one team, and then work our way down the grades from there. Unfortunately this often left the second team with a fragmented side, and as a result while the top team finished first after the home-and-away season, the second team finished last. Yet many young (and older) players within the Club were given the opportunity to play on turf and against quality opposition that they would otherwise not have got. I think the bigger picture needs to be seen here. Our Club will be better for the experience.

I congratulate Pat Anderson on the way he handled a difficult year. We do not know the set up for next year yet, but I am sure that the experience will prove beneficial in the long run.

First Grade, after dominating for much of the year, and finishing minor premier, unfortunately were narrowly defeated in the semi-final. Those involved know that with an ounce of luck we could have gone all the way, but it was just not to be it seems. From a personal point of view, that team has a tremendous spirit, and if all or most back up again next year, I'm sure we can bring that premiership home.

Fourth Grade, having moved up a grade from the previous year, once again showed that there is some tremendous talent within the Club. They made the Grand Final for the third successive year, but also went down narrowly. The team did manage to win the inaugural NDCA Twenty20 B Grade Cup with a great win in the final at Dukes Oval. This team has developed a great camaraderie and it is easy to see why they are successful – they play for each other. I sincerely hope that Anthony, Ben and the boys will be back firing again next year.

Another event that gave me great inspiration during the year was the 8th Grade side turning up en-masse to the Trivia Night. They looked great (dressed as umpires) and won the event. These guys may not win every game, but they epitomise the true sense of the word 'team'. Well done 8th Grade!

In the Juniors it was left to the u/12s, admirably coached by Steve Masters, to fly the flag. Unfortunately, the boys went down in the Grand Final, but they did themselves and the Club proud. We reckon the u/10s would have cleaned up if finals were played in this age-group, but they have plenty of time on their side.

To all our Junior coaches, managers and parents, a sincere thank you on behalf of the Club for your selfless and untiring efforts throughout the year. I sincerely hope that season 2009/10 will see you all with us again in some capacity.

Our In-2-Cricket programme proved to be a great success, with head coach John Tooth and chief administrator Ange Barbaro doing a great job. We view this programme as essential to the long-term success of this Club, so it was very pleasing to see nearly 50 children running around each Saturday morning.

I say it every year, but thanks once again to my committee. The successful organisation of the Club does not just happen by itself. These men and women simply get stuck in, and do what is necessary, with little fanfare. Trevor Wilson (Vice President), Jim Micsko (Secretary), Jamie Large (Treasurer), Liz Dowd (Junior Secretary), Sam Barbaro (Equipment officer), Ange Barbaro, Sue Masters and Miles Anderson, the whole Club thanks you.
