

# COMMITTEE REPORTS

## **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

This is my first report as the President, the experience so far has been great. It is a pleasure to serve the club, and a warm thank you to all for your support over the last year.

The Emu Plains Cricket Club enjoyed another successful season, with the club fielding eight senior teams and eight junior teams. All across the club, over 250 people enjoy a game of cricket. In seniors, six teams made the finals. Of the six, three teams made the grand final, with 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and 4<sup>th</sup> grade being beaten on the day. The might and power of the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade team saw the "Rotten Oranges" secure a premiership. We will hear from Ange Barbaro, the captain of the third grade team later in the presentation.

For Juniors, Season 2015/16 saw a total of 105 players putting on the red and white, forming nine junior teams. This is an increase of 24 players, and two teams above our 2014/15 playing numbers. Of the eight junior teams, three made the semi-finals, with the under 15 Ponting team making the semi-final for the first time since starting as a group in under eights. Unfortunately all of the teams were beaten in the semi-finals.

Our In2Cricket program again was a success with Chris Longhurst and his helpers again taking to Dukes Oval every Saturday morning leading up to Christmas with our youngest recruits. If you have the chance you should try to get down to "the Duke" and enjoy watching around 70 children enjoying a chance to run around and have a bat and a bowl. Well done Chris, the Club is very appreciative of your efforts to this program over a long period of time.

Thank you to all the team captains, junior coaches, managers, parents and supporters, for your efforts throughout the season. The tasks are never ending but your work is appreciated.

A final thank you to my fellow Committee members. We should all acknowledge the amount of work that goes on behind the scenes, and the numerous hours each committee member donates to the running of the club. Thank you all.

Congratulations to Ange Barbaro and his merry OLD (and some not so old) men for playing in a great spirit all year.

Alex Mullen's 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade side and Peter Gibson's 4<sup>th</sup> Grade boys also had outstanding seasons and were at the top or near the top of the ladder all season long. Both teams made it to the last weekend of the season but ran into some pretty tough opposition and couldn't quite get the job done. Both teams have been consistently building for a number of years now, have well-balanced sides, and with a bit of luck, this time next year they'll be proud Premiers.

Marty's 1<sup>st</sup> Grade team could not make it four premierships in a row but were still the benchmark for most of the season, despite losing three top-class fast bowlers from the 2014/15 team. They competed in the semi-final but were well beaten on the day.

However, this team was made up of a lot of young guys playing their first season of senior cricket, with some older heads helping to show them the way. With six out of eight sides making the finals we actually improved our position in the NDCA Club Championship, from 5<sup>th</sup> place in 2014/15 to 3<sup>rd</sup> place this season. It was a tight competition again but we're tracking upwards and hope to continue this improvement in 2016/17.

The season once again kicked off in September with the popular 7 a side gala day held at Dukes Oval this time. Congratulations to the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade side, very well led by Andy Price, in taking out the trophy. ## JUNIOR REPORT

Emu Plains Cricket Club had a successful season participating in the Penrith District Junior Cricket Association competitions. Whilst we did not contest a grand final, we had the following team placings:

Under 10 - 2nd (there are no semi-finals matches in Under 10s)

Emu Plains also fielded teams in the Under 9 and Under 8 age groups, which are non-competitive competitions. These teams had good seasons, with plenty of promise shown by all players in these age groups. It was particularly pleasing to see the Under 8s in their distinct training shirts and having 3 sponsors. This has been encouraged by the club and we are looking to create similar arrangements for all teams - senior and junior - in 2016/17.

Season 2015/16 saw a total of 105 players putting on the red and white, forming nine junior teams. This is an increase of 24 players, and two teams, above our 2014/15 playing numbers.
