

With six senior teams taking the field and 5 making the finals, we continue to be the most successful club in the district by a long margin. Congratulations and well done to 3rds, 4ths and 5th for making the finals, unfortunately out played on the day and bad luck to 8th grade for just missing a finals berth in the final week of the competition.

On the field

As per previous seasons the we kicked off in September with the popular 7 a side gala day held at Dukes Oval. Thanks again to David Betts for volunteering his time to prepare a pitch for our use, and to all of the committee members and volunteers who make this a great day for all.

The committee incorporated some feedback from previous years and involved the juniors much more heavily in this tournament, with the junior teams jointly winning the trophy with a tie in the final. The gala day remains a terrific way to start the season and we hope to get even more teams and players teams involved next year.

Marty Romer in first grade had a very rocky start to the year, with constant late team changes, including the use of 5 third grade players in one round early in the season. These shortages were successfully overcome and the difficult start to the season was forgotten and once again win the Evans Shield to make it 2 in a row. Congratulations again Marty, a great outcome and we all look forward to seeing you defend the title again and make it 3 in a row for the second time.

Alex Mullen's team was, with some trepidation, elevated to the 2nd grade, and proved worthy by winning the competition. As Alex might say, the Buggs, Worms and Grubbs call came good at the right time of the seaon, and performed very well to defeat the minor premiers in the grand final. The comraderie and spirit in this team is building and will go on to win many more premierships.

Our team in 3rd grade again performed well and finished in second place after the regular season. Unfortunately we saved a pretty ordinary performance for the semi final and lost to Glenbrook, who we had beaten in our previous 2 meetings. Special thanks again to Sam for sitting out in the Semi Final. Glenbrook went through to the final and were easily beaten by the minor premiers Glenmore Park.

Following Alex's elevation to second grade, we fielded a different 4th grade squad this year. This squad was ably led by Mick Lambert and performed well to make the semi final. It is a squad full of talent and will no doubt be celebrating premiership success in the very near future. Mick's team put on a very good display and put eventual premiers Glenmore Park through some nervous moments by chasing 222 with a score of 203.

The 5th grade squad is a team put together after some players decided to (successfully) try their hand in higher grades. The squad did really well and was always competitive finishing in the semi final where they we beaten by the St Clair Hawks who went on to win the competition,

Captain Josh Lawson has led his team for two years now, and took this current squad with striking distance of the finals, only to finish in 5th place. Our thanks go to Josh for leading this team well. It was often difficult to fill this team, but with our juniors always looking for opportunities they were rarely short. With another season of senior experience now under their belts, this team will feature in finals in the future.

Off the field

We welcomed back our front of shirt and sleeve sponsors this year with the One Agency Reeves Properties and Metwest Engineering who continued with the whole of club shirt sponsorships. Metwest also provided weekly \$50 senior player of the round vouchers redeemable at the club. It is expected that this failed trial will now revert either back to the competition in place prior to the trial, or another format. In order to influence the playing competition format, we will again write to the NDCA committee asking for them to consider changing the playing conditions to include three formats of the game, with 1 day, T20 and 2 day matches throughout the season. This will be heard by the NDCA in due course with the outcome known by the start of next season.

Our commitment to promoting junior players into the senior competition continues and will continue in the future. There will always be a place for Emu Plains juniors in the senior team squads. We again issued many free registrations for all players under 20 playing in the senior competition and will continue to do so. Our enviable reputation throughout the district attracts new players to us, and we are always happy to fit them in. With new players coming to the club, and with our outstanding junior playing base our club is well positioned to continue its winning way well into the future.

Finally, thank you to my other fellow Committee members for all of the hard work completed throughout the year. Running a club of this size and quality is not an easy task and your effort remains outstanding.

Congratulations to everyone involved in the Club for a successful and enjoyable season. I sincerely hope to see you all, players and committee back in the red cap in 2019/2020.

PERPETUAL TROPHY WINNERS

KEITH COLEMAN MEMORIAL SHIELD (SENIOR ALL ROUNDER)

Awarded to the Senior Player who has accumulated the most points during the season. Points are allocated for the 1st innings of each game, semi-finals and finals excluded. Allocation of points is outlined in the constitution.

Ricky Ciampi 720 points

TONY HOY SHIELD (SENIOR CRICKETER OF THE YEAR)

Awarded to the senior player who has accumulated the most points, obtained from each round. Players doubling up with a second team in the same round shall also be included. Players from each senior team shall vote at the end of each round on best performed player. Points shall be awarded as 3 for the player who contributed the most to the match followed by 2 and 1 for the next best performed players. At the completion of round 14 player's points are to be tallied.

DAVE RISTAU MEMORIAL TROPHY (SENIOR WICKET KEEPER)

Awarded to the senior cricketer with the most dismissals as a Wicket Keeper during the Season.

CRAIG HUTHNANCE MEMORIAL TROPHY (1st GRADE CRICKETER OF THE YEAR)

Awarded to the most outstanding player in the first grade team for the season, final games included. Allocation of points is outlined in the constitution.

Patrick Anderson 367 points

A & E RISTAU AWARD (U/21 BATTING AGGREGATE)

Awarded to the player (Junior Competition only or Senior Competition only) who is under the age of 21 years at 30 September of that season, who has scored the most runs for the Club. Competition matches only – semi & final games not included.

Lachlan Jacobs 320 runs

THE HALLY AWARD (U/21 BOWLING AGGREGATE)

Awarded to the player (Junior Competition only or Senior Competition only) who is under the age of 21 years at 30 September of that season, who has taken the most wickets for the Club. Competition matches only – semi & final games not included.

Justin McColl 26 wickets

SENIOR CATCHING AWARD

Awarded to the senior player that has taken the most catches as a fielder (non-wicketkeeper) in competition rounds only. Finals games are not included.

Ricky Ciampi 20 catches

CLUBMAN OF THE YEAR

Awarded to the person deemed to have contributed the most to upholding the spirit of the Club during the past season. The winner, chosen by the Executive Committee, may be a player (junior or senior), a committee member, a coach/manager, a parent, a supporter or any combination of these. It is not compulsory that the award be given if an appropriate candidate is not nominated that season.

SHIELD OF SHAME (MOST SENIOR DUCKS)

Awarded to the senior cricketer who has achieved the most ducks during the season.

SENIOR ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Awarded to the senior cricketer playing his first full season in seniors after having played the previous season for Emu Plains juniors. The award recognises performance as well as what the recipient has contributed to upholding the spirit of the Club.

LONG SERVICE AWARDS

OFFICIALS (EIGHT YEARS SERVICE)

At the completion of eight years' service as a coach, manager or executive committee member (or a combination of these) the Executive Committee may approve by majority vote the award of a Long Service Award to such person. Service need not be continuous.

SPECIAL SERVICE AWARD - UNDER 16 YEARS

Players who play continuously with the Club from Under 9 to Under 16 shall receive an award at the annual presentation in recognition of their contribution to the Club. Team Coaches and Managers who meet the criteria shall also be eligible to receive the award.

SPECIAL SERVICE AWARD - SENIORS

Senior players who have played with the Club for a period of ten years shall receive an award. Years of service need not be consecutive. Records commence with season 1989/90. Service prior to those years has not been accurately recorded by the Club.

Awarded to players who play 100 games for the club, without breaking that service to play for another club within the Nepean/Penrith District.

Having 10 players and only being able to bat and bowl 8 each week created some challenges but we settled on a system where our 2 subs would keep wicket each week. The kids were fantastic despite occasionally not getting to bat and bowl there were never any complaints and everyone showed great team spirit and gave their all no matter which part they had to play that week.

We started the season with some up and down performances. When we were good we were great, but we let ourselves down in a few games early in the season with some sloppy fielding and some crazy running between the wickets. This saw us lose 3 of our first 6 games.

By the mid point of the season the team had begun to show some real improvement with their skills. In particular our bowling and fielding improvement had seen us assert ourselves as the best fielding team in the competition. The team had also started to put a higher price on their wickets and had drastically improved our running between the wickets.

From round 7 on we only dropped 1 game as the team really found some form and confidence going into the semis.

We finished the regular season in 2nd place having taken 20 wickets more than any other team, conceded 200 runs less than any other team and lost 11 wickets less than any other team.

We defeated Glenbrook/Blaxland in the semi 1/161 to 6/129 with easily our best batting performance of the season. We didn't panic in the field when the game started to get close and rallied with some late wickets to put it beyond doubt.

We played Springwood in the grand final and after bowling first and taking 15 wickets we never really let them into the game, winning 6/168 to 15/105. A well deserved premiership for a fantastic group of kids.

I would like to thank all the parents for their help through out the year whether it be scoring, helping out at training and being so understanding of the 10 player situation.

COOPER COLLINS - A fantastic team man who played his best 2 games of the year when it mattered. Capable batter and bowler

COOPER HEGARTY - The most feared fast bowler in the competition. One of our strongest bats.

JOSH KOUTZAS - One of the most improved in the team. One of our frontline bowlers by seasons end.

NOAH MCLEAN - A consistent performer with bat and ball throughout the year. One of our best fielders.

KAHLAN MOUWEN - A talented leg spinner who took the teams first ever hat trick. Improved out of sight with the bat over the season.
