SENIOR REPORT

Marty Romer in first grade had another successful year, again reaching the grand final, only to go down to Glenmore Park, who celebrated their first premiership in the top grade. Congratulations again Marty for leading this team toward many finals series, and to Glenmore Park for their first win.

Alex Mullen's team having won the year before, proved it was no fluke by winning the comp again in a dominating, season-long table-leading display. 2nd grade took on Glenmore Park in the final and won with only 3 wickets down and overs to spare.

3rd grade performed well and was competitive throughout the season, finishing second but then losing to the third placed St Marys in the semi-final. The comp was won by Glenbrook Blaxland who were the best team in third grade all season and were deserved winners.

Mick Lambert and his vocal 4th Grade side took it all the way, winning the Trevor Wholohan trophy for only the second time in the club's long history. Well done to Mick and his entire squad.

Andrew Luzzi's 5th Grade boys also had a successful season finishing in 4th place. The boys took a strong position on the first day of the semi-final but were unable to overcome some good bowling by Cranebrook, who went on to win the competition. Congratulations to Cranebrook for their win.

This was the first year back playing a combined one and two day format which was enjoyed by most. There will be another proposal made in this off season to include some T20 matches throughout the season, which may address some of the difficulties in fielding teams around Christmas time, and during the heat spells in January. This will be heard by the NDCA in due course with the outcome known by the start of next season.

We will continue our commitment to juniors with free registrations into the senior competitions and provide opportunities for juniors to play in the senior teams as their experience and abilities allow. We will also continue our support for juniors coming into seniors by free registrations for all players under 20 playing in the senior competition. With new players coming to the club, and with our outstanding junior playing base, our club is well positioned to continue its winning way well into the future.

Finally, thank you to my other fellow Committee members for all the hard work completed throughout the year.


